Over the years he has taken many guises, & has been a featured poet at the Houston Poetry Fest, a contributing editor for lyric poetry review, a board member for Mutabilis Press, a member of the selection for Public Poetry, & at present he is coordinating a small reading soirée called Poetry FIX, at FIX Coffeebar.
