This award will be presented in honor of Robert Clark (organizer of the First Friday Poetry Reading Series and the Houston Poetry Fest), because of his promotion of poetry in the Houston area. The winner will be announced in April 2009, National Poetry Month.

REQUIRED: The competition is open to all poets residing in the US, aged eighteen or older. The judge will consider only original work written in English; if originally written in another language, only the English translation will be considered. The theme is open, with no special line requirements. Controversial subjects are welcome, though profanity and graphic language are not. One poem per poet, typed within the body of an e-mail; attachments not opened. Simultaneous submissions permitted and poems may have been previously published, so long as the author has retained the copyright, and names its previous publishers. E-mail can mangle line turns; left-justify all poems, beware of too-long lines. Poems entered will be considered as finished; no changes. Beneath the poem, include full mailing address and e-mail address. This will not be shared. A brief biography relating to your writing background would be appreciated, although first-time poets are also encouraged to submit their work.

AGE LIMIT: Eighteen or older. (Those sixteen to eighteen may enter with permission of a parent if the young person is a member of a chapter of the Poetry Society of Texas.)

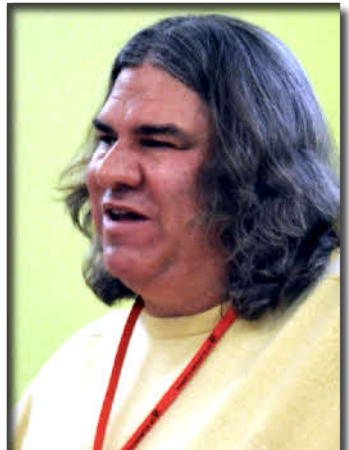

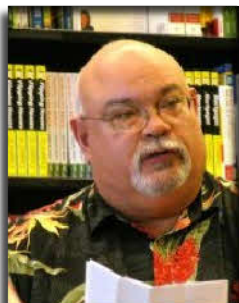
MARCH'S FEATURED POET
