That life has been occasionally punctuated by writing fantasy and neo-romantic poetry and creating live action role play and story lines for her and her friends at Science Fiction Conventions, the occasional dressing up in 19th century sailor outfits on the 1877 Barque Elissa in Galveston for the pleasure of Girl Scouts everywhere. and blogging about it on line at chaosbutterfly.com. She does most all of this from her sailboat home in beautiful Clear Lake Shores, Texas. She's been published in Oak Leaves, newsletter for Árn Draíocht Féin, and on Chaosbutterfly.com, and has two self published chapbooks, "Chaos Cats and Magic" and "Of Comets and other Celestial Things", no longer in print. There are even times when she gets a break from all that and actually goes sailing.

"In the picture [above right], I am sailing back from Port Lavaca on my way to Clear Lake Shores, a 24 hour trip by sail. We are around 10 miles off shore and there is no land in site. Those waves were around 10 feet and were slamming us to the point that most of the crew was sick. I managed to stay free of sea sickness by downing a lot of ginger snaps. Ploughshares: First Place - 2010 Pushcart Prize http://www.pshares.org/

Ploughshares was founded in 1971 by DeWitt Henry and Peter O'Malley in the Plough and Stars, an Irish pub in Cambridge, Massachusetts. Since 1989, Ploughshares has been based at Emerson College, which hosts one of the best M.F.A. programs in creative writing in the country. Published in April, August, and December in quality paperback, each issue is guest-edited by a prominent writer. Literary Magazine Review has proclaimed Ploughshares to be "a magazine that has published a good deal of what has become our significant contemporary American literature."

Submit one prose piece or one to three poems. A citation of publications and awards is helpful. Poems should be individually typed either single- or double-spaced on one side of the page. Margins flushed left instead of justified. Reading period: June 1 to January 15 (postmark dates). All submissions sent from January 16 through May are returned unread. We adhere very strictly to these dates. Since we operate on a first-received, first-read basis, we cannot make exceptions or hold work. Submit your work at any time during our reading period; if a manuscript is not timely for one issue, it will be considered for another. Our backlog is unpredictable, and staff editors ultimately have the responsibility of determining for which editor a work is most appropriate. - (1) Four copies of no more than five poems, totaling no more than five typed pages, with their titles but without your name or other identifying marks on these pages (which will be assigned a poet number and sent to the judges for blind judging); retain copies, as these will not be returned, but shredded after judging is complete.
- (2) A cover letter, with name, address, phone numbers, e-mail address, and a list of the titles of your poems.
- (3) A brief biography, for the anthology in case your poems are chosen.
- (4) A stamped self-addressed #10 envelope, for notification of outcome.
- (5) A tax-deductible donation of \$15 to Houston Poetry Fest, a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt organization.

The judges will see only the pages of poetry and, scoring each set of poems as a whole, will select approximately 20 to 25 poets as "Juried Poets". These poets will receive:

- (2) their names listed in the official printed program and on the website,
- (3) inclusion of one of their poems in the Houston Poetry Fest 2009 Anthology, and
- (4) one free copy of the Anthology. Additional copies of the Anthology may be purchased at the event or by mail.

The readings will be free and open to the public. You may invite as many guests as you wish. In addition, two or more open readings will be scheduled during the week at which you and your friends are welcome to read. 
